SEMINAR DESCRIPTION

Create a fun, interactive educational program with lesson units supported by manipulatives to address skills needed by both special needs and regular education students. Materials are low tech, low cost, and often free of charge from commonly found or recycled materials. Lesson units address team building strategies, educational and functional skills, and adaptations to address special needs. This interactive seminar provides lots of opportunities to develop your creativity, problem solve actual situations, and share resources and ideas. You will leave this two-day training with your own shoebox of ideas and materials that can be implemented immediately in the clinic, classroom, pre-vocational training program, or home. Information learned in this seminar is appropriate for use in classroom settings for educators, home settings for parents with and without children with special needs, and therapy settings for therapists working in pediatrics through geriatrics (with some minor adaptations for adults). This seminar provides an introduction to more in-depth learning.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

By the end of this seminar, each participant will be able to

- Create a variety of low-cost, low-tech manipulatives and learning games that teach functional skills in the classroom and home to support educational programs and goals.
- Role play and create collaborative lesson plans, classroom activities, and team building strategies.
- Utilize a variety of sensory motor activities and exercises to support learning, motor skill development, and behavior management.
- Assess and determine low-cost ways to adapt the environment to the specific needs of children with and without disabilities
- Understand important aspects of ergonomic and architectural design in developing play spaces and residential/public spaces for children.
- Determine which products and adaptations will enhance self-care skills and daily living activities, including vocational skills using low-cost assistive technology interventions and sensory motor programs.
- Use Brain Gym, Ball-A-Vis-X, Irlen Filters, and Kinesthetic approaches for teaching handwriting, keyboarding, math, reading, and developmental cognitive and motor skills.

INSTRUCTOR

Shoshana Shamberg, MS, OTR/L, has over 30 years of experience as an educator, therapist, and professional trainer. She has presented over 150 international continuing education training seminars on a variety of topics related to independent living services for people with disabilities and aging adults. She has degrees in both occupational therapy and special education with a specialization in assistive technology and environmental modifications. She specializes in educational programming for students with severe disabilities and people of all ages with learning differences and challenges. She is a Certified Brain Gym Consultant and Certified Irlen Scotopic Sensitivity Syndrome Screener/ Diagnostician. Her company, The Irlen Visual Learning Center of Maryland, is the only provider of Irlen diagnostic services in Maryland.

Ms. Shamberg teaches the only Internet-based training program on accessibility consulting and home modifications for healthcare and design/build professionals. This mentoring and training program has an international participation. She has authored numerous articles and textbook chapters on a wide variety of topics including sensory motor learning and accessibility consultation. She is currently the AOTA representative to the American National Standards Institute's Accessible Design Standards Building Code Committee (ICC/ANSI A117.1), the Maryland representative to the AOTA IDEA Partnership Advisory Committee, a guest instructor in Towson University's Department of Occupational Therapy, and board member and legislative committee co-chairperson for the Maryland Occupational Therapy Association.
